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



Invited Speakers



Rob Vos, is Director of the Markets, Trade, and Institutions Division (MTID) at the International Food Policy Research Institute since September 2017. He is also coordinator of the Food Security Portal. Previously, he was Director of Agricultural Development Economics at the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO. He has also served as FAO's director for social protection, rural employment, and gender equality and as coordinator of FAO's strategic program for rural poverty reduction. Rob holds honorary professorships at the International Institute of Social Studies, The Hague and FLACSO-Ecuador.



Jayson Lusk is Distinguished Professor and Head of the Agricultural Economics Department at Purdue University. He earned a BS in Food Technology from Texas Tech and a PhD in Agricultural Economics from Kansas State. He held previous appointments at Mississippi State and Oklahoma State Universities and the French National Institute for Agricultural Research. He serves on the executive committee of the USDA National Agricultural Research, Extension, Education, and Economics (NAREEE) Advisory Board.

Lusk is a food and agricultural economist who studies what we eat and why we eat it. He has been interviewed and published editorials in outlets such as the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, USA Today, and the Washington Post, and has appeared on numerous network and national cable television shows. Lusk has published more than 250 articles in peer reviewed journals, including several of the most cited papers in the agricultural economics profession. He has authored five books, the latest being Unnaturally Delicious. Lusk has received numerous awards including the Borlaug Communication Award from the Council for Agricultural Science and Technology and the Lou Ann Aday award, Purdue University's most prestigious research award in the humanities and social sciences. He is a fellow and past president of the Agricultural and Applied Economics Association.



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Shenggen Fan is Chair Professor at China Agricultural University (CAU). Prior to joining CAU, Shenggen Fan was director general of the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) from 2009 to 2019. Dr. Fan joined IFPRI in 1995 as a research fellow, conducting extensive research on pro-poor development strategies in Africa, Asia, and the Middle East. He led IFPRI's program on public investment before becoming the director of the Institute's Development Strategy and Governance Division in 2005. He served as member, vice chair and chair of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on Food and Nutrition Security. Dr. Fan was awarded an honorary life member of the International Association of Agricultural Economists (IAAE) in 2018, and became Fellow of American Applied Economics Association (AAEA) in 2020. In 2014, Dr. Fan received the Hunger Hero Award from the World Food Programme in recognition of his commitment to and leadership in fighting hunger worldwide.

Shouying Liu is professor, doctoral supervisor and dean of School of Economics, Renmin University of China. He studies land system and economic development, transformation and upgrading of manufacturing industry, etc. He has hosted more than 30 national, provincial and ministerial projects including the Emergency Management Projects of National Natural Science Foundation of China, the Key Projects of National Social Science Foundation of China, and the Humanities and Social Sciences Research Projects of Ministry of Education. He has over 10 publications including a translation, Property Rights and Institutional Change: Literature Collection of Property Right School and Neoinstitutional School, and monographs like Investigations on China's Land Issues: Land Rights from the Civilian Perspective, Land System Reform and Economic Development in China. He is also the author of more than 160 articles published in World Development, Cities, Oxford Bullet of Economics and Statistics, China Agricultural Economic Review, Xinhua Digest (Xinhua Wenzhai), Qiushi, Economic Research Journal (Jingji Yanjiu) and Management World (Guanli Shijie), etc. His research works have won the first prize of the sixth and eighth Outstanding Achievements Award in Scientific Research (Humanities and Social Sciences), the seventh Pei-Kang Chang Award for Outstanding Achievements in Development Economics, and the China Development Research Award, etc.

Dan Yang is professor and head of Department of Agro-forestry Economics and Management, College of Economics and Management, Southwest University. She is also a visiting scholar at Toulouse School of Economics and International Food Policy Research Institute. She serves as syndic of Chinese Association of Agro-Technical Economics, and is selected as "Bayu Scholar (Youth Scholar)" and "Academy and Technology Leader (Backup Candidate)" of Chongqing. Her researches focus on agricultural industrial organizations, and rural poverty, rural resources environment and other economic issues. She has published broadly in academic journals, books and conferences, and made several presentations at the international academic conferences in USA, Germany, France and other countries. She leaded more than 20 academic projects sponsored by the Asian Development Bank, National Social Science Funds (NSSF) of China and so on. She won several awards including the Best Paper Award of CAER-IFPRI International Academic Conference, the first Annual Scholar Honor of Chinese Youth Agricultural Economists Forum, Development Research Award of Chongging Municipal Government and so on.



10:30-11:30 Roundtable Forum: Urban-Rural Integration Development in the Post-Covid-19 Era

Moderator: Prof. Junfei Bai, Associate Editor of CAER, China Agricultural University

Overview:

In China, the household registration system and a series of associated policies that have been put in place over half a century have primarily divided the nation into two worlds -- rural and urban. Since the 18th National Congress of the Communist Party of China(CPC), China has made great efforts in promoting urbanization and balancing economic development between rural and urban areas. However, barriers still exist.

Recently, the CPC and the Stata Council announced guidelines on the promotion of integrated urbanrural development, aiming to promote rural revitalization and to fuel the modernization of agriculture and rural society by eradicating all barriers that restrict the free movement of resource, such as capital, talents, between urban and rural. According to this guideline, China will put in place more sound systems and mechanisms for promoting the integrated development by 2035 and will meet the goal of realizing the comprehensive integration of urban-rural areas and rural revitalization by the middle of the century.

These goals are ambitious but with significant challenges. At the same time, the globally-spreading COVID-19 has brought more uncertainties to the world even though it has been largely contained in China. Whether and how it could affect the realization of the integrated urban-rural development goals remain unknown. In this roundtable panel, we invite five distinguished professors and attendees to share their thoughts and insights on these issues. The potential topics to discuss include (but not limited to) the challenges we may face, approaches we may take, international experiences and lessons we may share, and the potential impacts from COVID-19, in promoting China's rural-urban integration.
